**ASCE Adopts New Post-Disaster  
Assessment Manual**



The Society has created and approved a new manual that outlines policies and procedures to be used when conducting engineering assessments of the damage caused by natural and human-caused disasters. The Post-Disaster Assessment Manual was developed by ASCE's Task Committee on Engineering Review Procedures in response to an independent task force's recommendation that the Society's procedures for such assessments be compiled into a single, readily accessible source. The task force, led by former U.S. Rep. Sherwood Boehlert, the former chairman of the House Science Committee, was commissioned in late 2007 to review how the Society participates in engineering studies of national significance. The Northeast Florida Chapter of the Florida Engineering Society (FES) is proud to encourage academic excellence in mathematics among middle school students by sponsoring MATHCOUNTS. A national coaching and competition program that promotes 6th, 7th and 8th grade math achievement in every U.S. state, MATHCOUNTS reaches thousands of students in classrooms across Florida as teachers integrate the program into their mathematics curriculum.

MATHCOUNTS stimulates student interest in math by making math achievement as challenging, exciting and prestigious as a school sport. Each fall, MATHCOUNTS distributes its free School Handbook and other coaching materials to schools across the country. Using these materials, teachers coach student "mathletes" either as part of in class instruction or as an extracurricular activity. After several months of coaching, participating schools select students to compete as teams and individuals in written and oral competitions. Students first compete in one of more than 500 local tournaments held across the country. Winners progress to state contests. There, the top four scorers in each state and the top coach earn an all-expense paid trip to the national finals in May at Walt Disney World's Swan and Dolphin Resort.

FES is anticipating over 40 public and private schools participating from Duval, Nassau, Clay, St. Johns, Baker, Columbia, Bradford and Union Counties, which translates into over 400 students. This would make participation for the Northeast Florida section one of the largest in Florida and in the Nation.

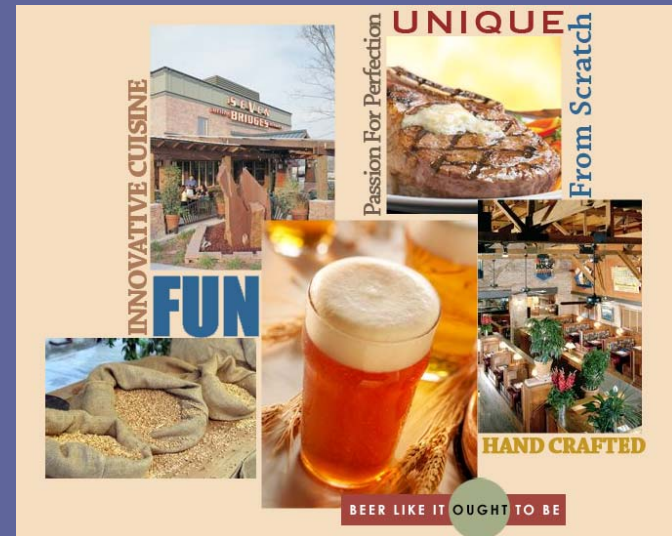

## 2010 NORTHEAST FLORIDA ENGINEERS WEEK ENDOWMENT FUND

Founded in 1951 by the National Society of Professional Engineers, Engineers Week is celebrated annually by thousands of engineers, engineering students, teachers, and leaders in government and business. In 1988, the National Engineers Week consortium expanded its scope and now includes more than 100 engineering, scientific and educational societies, and major corporations dedicated to enhancing the public understanding of the engineering profession and to promoting pre-college interest in math, science, and engineering as a career option.

We believe and recognize as a professional industry, that to achieve our Engineers Week objectives, we must include education as a key element. To that end, in 2005, in honor of Engineers Week, the **Northeast Florida Engineers Week Committee and the engineering community established a perpetual endowment scholarship fund at the University of North Florida.** The scholarship fund was established to enhance and facilitate the recruitment of engineering students in Northeast Florida with a minimum endowment goal of \$25,000 within a 5-year period. ***In 2009, through the financial support of local sponsorships, the Committee and the engineering community met that goal!***

The University of North Florida has grown remarkably over the years, celebrating its 35<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 2007. Over this relatively short time, UNF has developed a reputation for academic excellence and has become a critical resource to our community.

Likewise, the School of Engineering continues to be engaged in exceptional programs that serve the region, the state and beyond. Currently, the School serves over 400 upper division undergraduate and graduate

students - and over 700 students have graduated with engineering degrees from UNF since a small electrical engineering program opening in the mid-1990s.

With the large majority of its graduates remaining in the First Coast area, the School of Engineering places a high value on developing their students into leaders by providing opportunities for real world experience and emphasizing internship and placement opportunities.

Identifying, recruiting and retaining future leaders of the First Coast region of Florida is one of the major goals of merit-based scholarships at the University of North Florida. For the School of Engineering to become one of the premier centers for engineering education in Florida, it must recruit the best and brightest students and enable them to fulfill their potential.

Today, Northeast Florida is one of the most dynamic and economically viable regions of the country. In order to continue to grow and prosper, Jacksonville and its contingent communities must have a well-educated and visionary cadre of leaders. However, due to financial constraints, many exceptional students cannot afford the costs associated with a college degree.

Our commitment to support our students continues.

Therefore, the **2010 Northeast Florida Engineers Week Committee will continue to support the perpetual endowment established by the 2005 Committee's vision.** We will continue to fund this scholarship and other scholarships which will benefit the Northeast Florida community for generations to come.

*In 2009, through the financial support from the local engineering community, the E-Week Committee met the perpetual endowment scholarship goal of \$25,000 for the University of North Florida.*
